## 1 2 ORDINANCE NO. 0-2024-XXX 3 4 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF 5 OAKLAND PARK, FLORIDA AMENDING **SECTION 24-69** 6 ENTITLED "PATIOS, POOLS AND EXCAVATIONS" SUBSECTON 7 (B)(3) ENTITLED "POOL FENCING" OF THE CITY'S LAND 8 DEVELOPMENT CODE TO REQUIRE CERTAIN FINAL INSPECTION, 9 HEIGHT, LOCATION, AND MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR 10 SWIMMING POOL SAFETY BARRIERS, PROVIDING 11 SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR 12 CODIFICATION: PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE 13 14 WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it to be in the best interests of the City to 15 amend the City's Land Development Code to provide for certain final inspections, height, 16 location, and maintenance requirements for swimming pool safety barriers. 17 18 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY 19 OF OAKLAND PARK, FLORIDA, THAT: 20 21 22 The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as SECTION 1: 23 being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance. 24 25 Section 24-69(B)(3) of the City's Land Development Code is hereby SECTION 2: 26 amended as follows: 27 28 Sec. 24-69. - Patios, pools and excavations. 29 (B) *Swimming pools*. 30 31 (3) Pool fencing: All pools shall be enclosed by a permanent fence at least four (4) feet in 32 height with all access gates being self-closing and self-latching or be completely 33 enclosed by a screen enclosure, the exterior door of which to be self-closing and self-34 latching. Hot tubs or spas may be equipped with a locking cover in lieu of being fenced. 35 a. Application to existing residential swimming pools. All existing residential swimming pools, including above ground pools with side walls four feet or higher shall be brought 36 37 into compliance with this subsection no later than six (6) months after adoption of Ord. 38 No. 0-2008-024 [adopted on June 18, 2008] 39 (3) Swimming pool safety barriers: 40 (a) Required for final inspection of pool. The city shall not grant final inspection or 41 approval for any swimming pool unless an approved safety barrier has been erected. No 42 pool shall be filled with water unless a final inspection has been made and approved. 43 (b) Types permitted. The safety barrier shall consist of a screened-in patio, a wooden, 44 metal or vinyl fence, a masonry or concrete wall, so as to enable the owner to blend the

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safety barrier with the style of architecture planned for or existing on the property. A

fence, to meet the criteria as a barrier, shall not be climbable by a child 6 years old and

younger, and all rails must be placed facing the inside of the property. Walls shall be

(c) Height. The minimum height of the safety barrier for all swimming pools shall be not

erected to make them non-climbable by a child 6 years old and younger.

6	the roofs of buildings shall not require the installation of barriers.
