# CITY OF WESTON, FLORIDA ORDINANCE NO. 2024-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WESTON, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY, CREATING SECTION 95.07, TO BE ENTITLED "HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION CONSTRUCTION STAGING AREAS;" AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, First, the City Commission desires to revise the City Code by creating Section 95.07 to allow a Homeowners' Association to temporarily utilize a designated portion of Association property as a staging area during periods of approved construction; and

WHEREAS, Second, the City Commission finds that it is in the best interest of the City to adopt this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of Weston, Florida:

**Section 1.** The foregoing Whereas clauses are ratified and incorporated as the legislative intent and factual findings underlying this Ordinance.

### Section 2. Amendment to Chapter 95.

Chapter 95, "Property Maintenance" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Weston, is amended to read as follows:

### § 95.07 HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION CONSTRUCTION STAGING AREAS.

Notwithstanding any other provisions in the City Code to the contrary, the City Manager may, in his or her sole discretion, allow a Homeowners' Association to temporarily utilize a designated portion of Association Property as a staging area during periods of approved Construction for which the Homeowners' Association has been issued a permit by the City, subject to any time, location and other restrictions as determined by the City Manager.

#### Section 3. Codification.

It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of this Ordinance become and be made part of the City Code, and that the Sections of this Ordinance and Code may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section" or such other appropriate word or phrase to accomplish such intentions.

#### Section 4. Severability.

Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or other part of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any portion thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
