Section 2. Codification. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Charlotte County, Florida, and it is hereby provided that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made part of the Charlotte County, Florida Code of Ordinances that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or lettered to accomplish such intention, and that the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section" or "Article" or other appropriate designation. Section 3. Severability. If any portion of the foregoing conflicts with any other Charlotte County Code or other applicable law, the more restrictive shall apply if any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. Section 4. Effective Date. The effective date shall be as provided by law.
