ΑN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 656.313 (COMMUNITY/GENERAL COMMERCIAL CATEGORY), SUBPART C (COMMERCIAL USE CATEGORIES AND ZONING DISTRICTS), PART 3 (SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS) AND SECTION 656.805 (DISTANCE LIMITATIONS), PART 8 (ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES), CHAPTER 656 (ZONING CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO REVISE VARIOUS REGULATIONS RELATED TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending Section 656.313 (Community/General Commercial Category), Subpart C (Commercial Use Categories and Zoning Districts), Part 3 (Schedule of District Regulations), Chapter 656 (Zoning Code), Ordinance Code. Section 656.313 (Community/General Commercial Category), Subpart C (Commercial Use Categories and Zoning Districts), Part 3 (Schedule of District Regulations), Chapter 656 (Zoning Code), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 656 - ZONING CODE

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PART 3. - SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS

* * *

SUBPART C. - COMMERCIAL USE CATEGORIES AND ZONING DISTRICTS

* * *

Sec. 656.313 - Community/General Commercial Category.

This category allows a wide range of retail sales and services

including general merchandise, apparel, food and related items. General commercial uses include offices, highway commercial, entertainment and similar other types of commercial developments.

The following primary and secondary zoning districts may be considered in the Community/General Commercial Category depicted on the Future Land Use Maps of the Comprehensive Plan.

A. Primary zoning districts. The primary zoning districts shall include the following:

- V. Commercial Community/General-2 (CCG-2) District.
 - (a) Permitted uses and structures.

(27) An establishment or facility which includes the retail sale of all alcoholic beverages including liquor, beer or wine for off-premises consumption.

* * *

- (c) Permissible uses by exception.
 - (13) An establishment or facility which includes the retail sale of all alcoholic beverages, not in conjunction with a restaurant, including liquor, beer or wine for on-premises consumption or offpremises consumption or both.

Section 2. Amending Section 656.805 (Distance limitations), Part 8 (Alcoholic Beverages), Chapter 656 (Zoning Code), Ordinance Code. Section 656.805 (Distance limitations), Part 8 (Alcoholic Beverages), Chapter 656 (Zoning Code), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 656 - ZONING CODE

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PART 8. - ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

* * *

Sec. 656.805. - Distance limitations.

Except as provided in other Sections, the distance limitations for on- and off-premises consumption of alcohol, beer and/or wine shall be as follows:

- (a) There shall be no limitations for the off-premises consumption of beer and wine.
- (b) There shall be not less than 500 1,500 feet from an established school or church for the off-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages, including beer and wine, and not less than 500 feet from an established adult entertainment or service facility.
- (c) There shall be not less than 500 feet from an established school or church for a restaurant serving alcoholic beverages, that does not qualify as a nightclub pursuant to Section 656.1601, Ordinance Code.
- (d) There shall be not less than 1,500 feet from an established school or church for the on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages, not in conjunction with the service of food, except as specifically provided herein.
- (e) These distance limitations shall not apply to a church or school located in a CN, CCG-1 or CCG-2 zoned district if the church or school is on a parcel of land with an unrelated principal use There shall be no less than 3,500 feet between two liquor license locations approved for the off-premises consumption of all alcoholic beverages.

Section 3. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any other necessary to make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
